# **Overview**

QACenter is a suite of automated software quality products for enterprise and e-business applications. QACenter offers a comprehensive solution for IT organizations concerned with assuring quality and performance, while keeping pace with faster development cycles. QACenter includes:

**QADirector:** Coordinates the entire testing process by organizing, tracking, and executing automated and manual tests. QADirector integrates with Compuware's testing, program analysis, defect tracking, and requirements management tools.

The *QA*Director **Test Management Server** reads job submissions from the database, manages jobs, tracks available test execution machines, and manages the licenses for manual test Web execution. It also reports on the status of jobs in progress.

The *QADirector* **Test Execution Server** is installed on the local machine. The Test Execution Server allows jobs to run on a computer.

TrackRecord: Records and reports information about products being developed or supported. An object-oriented database contains recorded information on team members, testers, schedules, and defect reports retrievable using TrackRecord's query and reporting features.

**Reconcile:** Helps create and control project requirements. It stores the project requirements in a relational database. You can view the requirements through Microsoft Word, a reporting view (grid), and the Web. Use Reconcile to help you manage project development from conception through delivery.

TestPartner: Tests Web- and Windows-based applications that use Microsoft technologies. You can record user sessions with the application, add validation functions, and replay the sessions later to ensure that the application works as expected. TestPartner's scripting language is Visual Basic for Applications (VBA); it supports testing of Java, Visual Basic, and Visual C++ applications; browser-based Web applications; and COM components including both ActiveX controls and automation objects.

*QA*Hiperstation+: Works with mainframe *QA*Hiperstation to test hostbased applications directly from your Windows desktop. This integrated, workstation-based interface tool uses 32-bit code that provides improved performance and better stability on 32-bit Windows platforms.

QARun: Tests enterprise client/server applications. QARun creates and runs test scripts that support a wide variety of development tools and the diverse components of today's corporate environments. QARun couples advanced verification facilities with error-recovery mechanisms to reliably test local and remote applications.

Changepoint Request Management: Tracks defects managed using a builtin report designer. Allows testers to submit a defect from *QADirector* into Changepoint's Request Management system. Relevant information from *QADirector* is stored as a change request, while Changepoint's request management capability provides powerful workflow features allowing you make sure the defect is correctly assigned.

QALoad: Load tests enterprise client/server systems and associated networks. Can stress systems by simulating thousands of users simultaneously performing different operations. Creates and runs test scripts that simulate application transactions on systems without involving end users or their equipment.

*QACenter* Additional Installation Media Contents: In addition to the *QADirector* suite of products, the installation media includes Adobe Acrobat Reader, Microsoft Internet Explorer, Java 2 Development Kit, and Microsoft Virtual Machine installation programs. To install one or more of these products from the installation media, click **Install 3rd Party Software**, then click on the product installation you would like to perform.

#### **Installation Types**

The following installation options are available when you install *QADirector*:

Basic Installation: Install QADirector on one machine from the installation media using the default settings. See "Basic Installation" on page 17. In a Basic Installation the SQL Server Express 2005 database is installed along with all other components on a single machine.

Enterprise Installation Including Integrated Products: Install QADirector in a distributed environment and customize the install. See "Before You Begin" on page 21. In an Enterprise Installation, the SQL or Oracle database is usually installed on a separate machine which is set up as a database server.

If you purchased an integrated product refer to that product's *Installation and Configuration Guide* for information. There are some products with which QADirector integrates that require some configuration.

#### **Release Notes**

Review the Release Notes for information about new features, technical notes, and known issues that may enhance or impact your product's performance. Release Notes contain recent changes that may not be included in your *QA*Center product documentation.

View Release Notes from the installation media or on FrontLine, Compuware's product support Web site. The Release Notes on FrontLine are periodically updated as new information becomes available.

#### Accessing the Release Notes from the Installation Media

- 1 From the installation media browser, click the **QACenter** tab.
- 2 Locate the QADirector installation link and click the associated link for the Release Notes. The Release Notes open in your default Web browser.
- 3 Read the Release Notes online, or print the document.
- 4 After reading or printing the Release Notes, close the document to return to the installation media browser.

#### Accessing the Release Notes on FrontLine

- 1 Open a Web browser and go to http://frontline.compuware.com where the Welcome to FrontLine page appears.
- 2 On the right side of the page, enter your login ID and password and click **Login**.

#### **Installing the License**

A trial license is supplied with your *QA*Center product. During this 30day trial period, you are informed of how much evaluation time remains each time you start *QA*Director.

Install a permanent license at any time during the evaluation period. When the evaluation period expires, you **must** install a license to successfully run this product. Information about permanent license installation can be found in the *Distributed License Management Installation Guide*. Access this guide by clicking **Start>Programs>Compuware>QADirector>Documentation**.

Install Acrobat Reader (provided on the installation media) to view the online books in PDF format.

### **Basic Installation**

The following example provides the basic installation sequence for *QADirector* using the default database (SQL Server Express 2005) on one machine.

If you do not wish to install the **SQL Server Express 2005** database, then proceed with an **Enterprise Installation**. An example of full or enterprise installation in a distributed environment appears in "Completing an Installation" on page 21.

#### **Before You Begin**

- 1 Exit all non-essential Windows programs. Some Windows programs may interfere with the installation process.
- **2** Do one of the following:
  - ◊ If you are migrating from an earlier version see "Upgrading and Migrating Previous Versions of QADirector" on page 31.
  - ◇ If this is a new installation, continue.

#### **Installing QADirector**

Follow these steps to install QADirector:

- 1 From the installation media browser, click the **QACenter** tab.
- 2 Click the link to install *QA*Director. The Welcome dialog box appears.
- 3 Click Next. The License Agreement dialog box appears.
- 4 You must click **Yes** to continue with the installation. The **Customer Information** dialog box appears.
- 5 Type your name and company in the User Name and Company Name fields.
- 6 Click Next. The Choose Destination Location dialog box appears.
- 7 Choose the location in which to install QADirector. By default, QADirector installs in the Windows folder in Program Files\Compuware\QADirector. Click Browse to select an existing folder or type the to path name in the Path field. Click OK.
- 8 Click Next. The Select Components dialog box appears.
- **9** Check the selection(s) that apply to your environment. The next series of dialog boxes to display depend on your selections.
- 10 Click Next. Continue making any selections or revisions to the following dialog boxes until you reach the Select Program Folder dialog box.
- **11** Specify a location for the *QA*Director program shortcuts by typing a new folder, selecting an existing folder from the list, or accepting the default folder.
- 12 Click Next. The Start Copying Files dialog box appears and the programs are installed.
- **13** Click **Finish**. The computer is restarted if necessary.

#### **Configuring QADirector**

#### Setting Up an ODBC Data Source

Create a Windows ODBC DSN. Use the following SQL Server Express 2005 information, which was installed previously:

- ♦ **DSN Name:** *QA*Director (recommended)
- ◊ Server Name: <Machine Name>\QACenter
- ◊ User Name: sa
- Password: Enter the password you specified during installation, (if you did not specify a password, leave blank)
- ◊ DB Name: QACenter

**Note:** When SQL Server Express 2005 is initially installed, **sa** is the userid and the password is empty. It is possible that you may see a different userid in the ODBC applet in the control panel for this datasource. If so, please disregard, as **sa** is the correct userid.

For more information see Appendix B, "Setting Up a Net Service Name".

#### **Configuring QADirector**

- 1 Shut down the Test Management Server and the Test Execution Server if they are running on the computer.
- 2 Open the database configuration utility by clicking Start>Programs>Compuware>QADirector>Database Configuration Utility. The path to the software may vary slightly depending on your operating system.
- 3 Select SQL Server.
- 4 Select the DSN created in "Setting Up an ODBC Data Source" on page 18 and type the following in the appropriate locations:
  - ◇ DB Name: QACenter
  - ◊ Schema: Default
  - Output State St
  - Password: Enter the password you specified during installation, (if you did not specify a password, leave blank)
- **5** Click **Apply** (if enabled).
- 6 Click **Test** to verify the configuration.
- 7 Click OK.

#### Verifying the Installation

- Click Start>Programs>Compuware>QADirector>QADirector.
   The path to the software may vary slightly depending on your operating system.
- 2 Type admin for both the user name and password
- **3** Create a project (Example: Test1).

# Installing the QACenter Database on the Database Server Machine

Create a *QA*Center database manually or using the installation media. Manually creating and configuring a database consists of a series of procedures. To manually create and configure the database, refer to Appendix A, "Manually Creating and Configuring a Database".

To simplify this process, Compuware provides a database installation directly from the installation media. This section provides information about installing a *QAC*enter SQL Server or Oracle database using the Database Install on the installation media.

**Note:** Compuware recommends using the database installation from the installation media if you have no database administration experience.

#### Installing a SQL Server Database

#### Requirements

- An existing database server instance that runs a supported version of SQL Server. See "System Requirements" on page 12.
- The following specifics used to configure the database instance:
  - ◇ The SQL Server must be case insensitive at the time of installation.
  - ◊ If the database instance is defined, you must specify code page 1252 and sort order 52 (also known as ISO 8859-1).
  - ◊ If you are using SQL Server 2000, specify the SQL\_Latin1\_General\_CP1\_CI\_AS collation.
- An SQL Server user ID and password to allow the administrator to set up the database.

#### Installing the Database

- 1 Log on as a user with administrator permissions.
- 2 From the installation media, click **Install QA**Center **Products**.
- 3 Click **Databases**. The **Welcome** dialog box appears.
- 4 Click Next. The License Agreement dialog box appears.
- 5 Click Yes. The Database Management System dialog box appears.
- 6 Select Microsoft SQL Server 2000\2005 and click Next. The SQL Server Login Information dialog box appears.

- 7 Type the following information in the **Server Login Information** dialog box fields:
  - ◇ **Server** field: Database server name.
  - Login field: Database user name (must have sufficient permissions) Example: sa.
  - ◇ Password field: User password.
- 8 Click Next. The Database Selection dialog box appears.
- **9** Select the QADirector database to install and clear the **Reconcile** selection.
- **10** Click Next. The Database Information dialog box appears.
- **11** Type the following information in the **Database Information** dialog box fields:
  - ◊ **Database**: Database name.
  - ◊ Login: Database User name for new database (optional). New user account is created.
  - ◇ **Password**: Password for new user (optional).
- **12** Click **Next**. The **Review Settings** dialog box appears displaying information specified in the previous setup screens. To change any of the settings, click **Back**.
- **13** Click **Next** to begin creating the database. This may take a few minutes. The **Command Results** dialog box appears.

At the end of the installation, this dialog box displays a log containing all commands executed during the database creation. To save the log, select the text, copy and paste it into a text file, and save it.

**14** Click **Finish** to complete the database installation.

#### Installing an Oracle Database

#### Requirements

- An existing database server instance that runs supported versions of Oracle. Refer to "System Requirements" on page 12 for details.
- The following specifics used to configure the database instance:
  - When the Oracle database instance is defined, you must specify the Storage Character Set as iso 8859-1 West European.
  - The NLS\_LANGUAGE parameter should be set in the parameter file as:

 $NLS\_LANGUAGE = 'AMERICAN'$ 

If you are using Windows 2000, set the NLS\_LANGUAGE parameter to AMERICAN\_AMERICA.WE8IS08859P1 in the following locations:

HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\ORACLE\NLS\_LANG
HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\ORACLE\ALL\_HOMES\IDO\NLS\_LANG
HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\ORACLE\HOME-\NLS\_LANG

- ♦ You must know the Oracle user ID and password to allow the QADirector administrator to set up the Oracle.
- An Oracle Net Service created before installing an Oracle database. For further information see Appendix B, "Setting Up a Net Service Name".

#### Installing the Oracle Database

To install the QACenter Oracle database:

- 1 Log on as a user with administrator permissions.
- 2 From the installation media, click **Install QA**Center **Products**.
- 3 Click **Databases**. The **Welcome** dialog box appears.
- 4 Click Next. The License Agreement dialog box appears.
- 5 Click Yes. The Database Management System dialog box appears.
- 6 Select Oracle 9i\10g and click Next. The Oracle Login Information dialog box appears.
- 7 Type the following information in the **Oracle Login Information** dialog box fields:
  - ◇ **Service**: Service name.
  - Login: User/schema name (must have sufficient permissions)
     Example: sys.
  - ◇ **Password**: User password.
- 8 Click Next. The Database Selection dialog box appears.
- **9** Select the QADirector database and clear the **Reconcile** selection.
- **10** Click **Next**. The **Review Settings** dialog box appears displaying information specified in the previous setup screens. To change anything, click **Back**.
- **11** Click **Next** to begin creating the database. The **Command Results** dialog box appears.

At the end of the installation, this dialog box displays a log containing all commands that were executed during the database creation. To save the log, select the text, copy and paste it into a text file, and save it.

**12** Click **Finish** to complete the database installation.

### **Installing QADirector**

#### **Installing QADirector on a Client Machine**

Use this process to install QADirector on a client machine and repeat the process for every client in an Enterprise environment.

- 1 Log on as a user with administrator permissions.
- 2 From the installation media, click **Install QA**Center **Products**.
- 3 Click *QADirector*. The **Welcome** dialog box appears.
- 4 Click Next. The License Agreement dialog box appears.
- 5 Click **Yes**. The **Customer Information** dialog box appears.
- 6 Type your name and company in the User Name and Company Name fields.
- 7 Click Next. The Choose Destination Location dialog box appears.
- 8 Choose the location in which to install *QADirector*.

By default, QADirector installs in the Windows folder in Program Files\Compuware\QADirector. Click **Browse** to select an existing folder or type the path name in the **Path** field.

- 9 Click OK and click Next. The Select Components dialog box appears. Components to install appear as follows:
  - ♦ **Database Server:** Do not select this component.
    - Note: To install SQL Server Express 2005, click **Cancel** and see "Completing a Basic Installation" on page 17.
  - Test Management Server: Installs the Test Management Server on the local machine.
  - ◊ Test Execution Server: Installs the Test Execution Server on the local machine.
    - Note: Select these to install them on the same machine. To install them on separate machines, deselect these options and see "Installing the Test Management and Test Execution Servers" on page 26.
  - ♦ Windows Client: Installs *QADirector* on the local machine.

- ◇ IBM S/390 Support: Includes the QA 3270 Emulator Server, a utility program used to manage communications between your 3270 IBM mainframe emulator and QADirector. The QA 3270 Emulator Server includes the TN3270 Mainframe Emulator, a free emulator you can use for mainframe testing. If you prefer to use your own emulator, refer to the QA 3270 Emulator Server Readme file for a list of supported emulators. After installing QADirector, you can view the Readme file by clicking Start>Programs>Compuware>QADirector>QA 3270 Emulator Server>Readme.
- **10** Specify a location. Type a folder name, or select one from the existing folders list. The **Start Copying Files** dialog box appears.
- 11 Click Next. The Setup Status dialog box appears.
- **12** Click **Next**. The components are installed.
- 13 (Optional) Select the Display Release Notes check box when the Setup Complete dialog box appears.
- 14 Click Finish. The computer is restarted if necessary.

#### Installing the Test Management and Test Execution Servers

#### Installing the Test Management Server

To install a Test Management Server, follow steps 1–10 of Installing QADirector. Select to install the Test Management Server only and continue with the process.

#### Installing the Test Execution Server

To install a Test Execution Server, follow steps 1–10 of Installing QADirector. Select to install the Test Execution Server only and continue with the process.

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#### **Configuring QADirector**

To configure *QADirector* Client, first shut down the Test Execution Server (TES) and the Test Management Server (TMS).

Database connection information can be changed from within *QADirec*tor in the System Administration Center (See "Connecting from Within *QADirector*" on page 28.)

#### **Configuring QADirector for Oracle**

To configure *QA*Director for Oracle, ensure that you have an Oracle Net Service and that you create a Windows ODBC data source for the Oracle database. For information see Appendix B, "Setting Up a Net Service Name".

#### **Creating an ODBC Data Source**

- 1 Create an Oracle Net Service name using the Oracle Net Configuration Assistant.
- 2 Create a System DSN.

#### **Completing the Configuration**

- Run the Database Configuration Utility located in Start>Programs>Compuware >QADirector>Database Configuration Utility.
- 2 Select Oracle.
- 3 Click the list and select the data source name you created previously.
- 4 Type the schema name and the Oracle database user name and password.
- 5 Click OK.

For more information see Appendix B, "Setting Up a Net Service Name".

#### **Configuring QADirector Client For SQL Server**

To connect to the database before logging in to *QADirector*, create a data source and SQL Server DSN. Follow these steps:

#### **Creating an ODBC Data Source**

Create an ODBC DSN. For more information see Appendix B, "Setting Up a Net Service Name".

#### **Completing the Configuration**

- Click Start>Program Files>Compuware>QADirector>Database Configuration Utility. The Select Database Connection dialog box appears.
- 2 Select SQL Server.
- 3 Click the list and select the data source name you created previously.

4 Type the database name, schema name, and the SQL Server database user name and password.

#### **Configuring the Test Management and Execution Servers**

Multiple Test Management Servers can be created and configured with different priorities. The prioritized Test Management Server list appears in the TM Server List panel in the System Administration Center. These Test Management Servers will start according to priority.

Only one Test Management Server is the active Test Management Server at any particular time even though other Test Management Servers may be running. For example, if a Test Management Server with the priority of 1 fails to start, the Test Management Server with the priority of 2 will start in its place.

#### **Completing the Configuration**

Follow the steps for "Configuring QADirector for Oracle" on page 27 or "Configuring QADirector Client For SQL Server" on page 27.

#### **Connecting from Within QADirector**

To connect to the database from within QADirector, follow these steps:

- 1 Navigate to the System Administration Center.
- 2 From the Datasource panel click Actions>Change. The Select Database Connection dialog box appears.
- **3** Follow the steps for "Configuring QADirector for Oracle" on page 27 or "Configuring QADirector Client For SQL Server" on page 27.

#### **Configuring the QA3270 Emulator Server**

If you installed the optional IBM S/390 Support component, you may need to configure the *QA* 3270 Emulator Server to work with your mainframe emulator. To access the *QA* 3270 Emulator Server readme file, click **Start>Programs>Compuware>QADirector>QA** 3270 Emulator Server>Readme.

#### **Using the QADirector Tutorial**

To complete the QADirector tutorial, install TestPartner. The tutorial database is located in Program Files\Compuware\QADirector\Tutorial\MIBQADB\QAD4.MDB. For detailed instructions on using the tutorial, refer to the *QADirector Tutorial*, which can be accessed through online Help.

### **Configuring the Windows XP SP2 Firewall for QADirector**

With the release of Windows XP, Microsoft introduced a set of security technologies to improve the ability of Windows XP-based computers to withstand malicious attacks from viruses and worms. The Windows Firewall prevents unsolicited, inbound TCP/IP connections. Therefore, the Test Management Server, Test Execution Server, and various other test execution components may not communicate with each other while the Windows Firewall is active.

Consider the following when configuring QADirector:

- Networking should be configured to use the TCP/IP protocol with a static port of 1433.
- By default, SQL Server allows network connections using port 1433.
- The SQL Server machine should have the latest MS Data Access Components (MDAC2.71a). These are available with SQL Server Service Pack 3a or later. Without this version of MDAC, it is not possible to connect to the SQL Server 2000 installed on a Windows XP with Service Pack 2 operating system.
- By default the Web Server (IIS) Port 80 is blocked. Enable the port using the Windows Firewall dialog box.

Use this process in conjunction with Microsoft Windows XP Service Pack 2 to ensure that *QA*Director 05.01.00 works properly when the Windows Firewall is active:

- 1 Click Start>Control Panel>Windows Firewall. The Windows Firewall dialog box appears.
- **2** Click the **Exceptions** tab.
- 3 Click Add Program. The Add a Program dialog box appears.
- **4** Browse to the directory where QADirector is installed.
- 5 Select the following programs from the list of available programs: "QC\_TESRV.EXE, QC\_TMSRV.EXE, TDRV.EXE "TENG.EXE

If necessary, select the programs one at a time. It may be necessary to go back to the **Exceptions** tab each time a program is selected. Make sure the check box is selected for each of the *QADirector* programs.

#### **Obtaining the Correct Port Number For the Firewall**

The correct port number must be used for SQL Server to properly set up the Firewall. After the port number is obtained, you will return to the Exceptions tab to complete the setup.

- 1 Click Start>Programs>Microsoft SQL Server>Server Network Utility. The SQL Server Network Utility dialog box appears:
- 2 Select TCP/IP and click **Properties**. The **Properties** dialog box appears. The default port number is displayed in the Default port field.
- 3 Click Start>Control Panel>Windows Firewall. The Windows Firewall dialog box appears
- 4 Select the Exceptions tab.
- 5 Click Add Port. The Add a Port dialog box appears.
- 6 In the **Port number** field, type the port number from the **SQL Server** Network Utility.
- 7 Select the TCP option.
- 8 In the Name field, type a meaningful name.
- 9 Click OK. The Windows Firewall dialog box appears.
- **10** Click **OK**.

*QADirector* integrates with many Compuware automated testing, analysis, defect tracking, and requirements management tools. If you purchased an integrated product refer to that product's *Installation and Configuration Guide* for information.

### **Upgrading QADirector**

Install the latest version of *QA*Director directly over the previous version. It is not necessary to uninstall the previous version. If you must uninstall the previous version, refer to the Installation Guide for that version for instructions on how to uninstall.

#### **Upgrading the QADirector Database**

- 1 At the **QADirector Log In** screen, click the **Configure** button. The **Select a Database** dialog appears.
- 2 From the Data Source Type options, select SQL Server/MSDE or Oracle datasource.
- 3 In the Data Source Name field, select the exact name of the Database/ODBC connection to be migrated. The Database Name, and Schema/User Name/Password fields are filled in by default.
- 4 Click **Test** to verify that the information provided is correct. A test confirmation dialog appears.
- 5 Click OK. The QADirector Log In screen appears.
- 6 At the QADirector Log In screen, type the User Name and Password.
- 7 Click OK.
- 8 If necessary, click **Yes** to upgrade the database schema to the required schema level.

- **9** Click **Begin Upgrade**. The Current Item Progress, Overall Progress, and Upgrade Item indicators will display the ongoing progress of the database migration.
- **10** When the upgrade is complete, click **Close**.

# **Accessing Maintenance Mode**

To access maintenance mode for *QACenter* products, Compuware recommends using the Windows Control Panel.

**Required:** Compuware recommends that you exit all non-essential Windows programs before running this setup program. Some Windows programs may interfere with the installation process.

# Accessing Maintenance Mode from the Windows Control Panel

- Click the Windows Start button and select Settings>Control Panel. The Control Panel dialog box appears.
- 2 Select the Add/Remove Programs icon. The Add/Remove Programs dialog box appears.
- 3 Select the QACenter product to maintain and click **Change/Remove**. Three maintenance mode options display: modify, repair, and remove. For more information about these options, see the appropriate section in this chapter.

### **Modifying an Installation**

For products with optional components, you may want to add or remove a component. Rather than uninstall and re-install the product, you can modify your installation.

#### **Modifying Products With Optional Components**

- 1 Access maintenance mode described at the beginning of this chapter.
- 2 Select the **Modify** option and click **Next**. The **Select Components** dialog box appears allowing you to add or remove components.
- 3 Click Next. Setup will add or remove the appropriate components.
- 4 After modifying, you may be prompted to restart your computer. If you are prompted to restart your computer, you may choose to restart it now (recommended) or to restart it later.
- 5 Click **Finish** to complete the maintenance.

#### **Repairing an Installation**

There may be times when you will need to repair a damaged *QA*Center product installation. This could be due to an inadvertent deletion or corruption of the program. To repair your *QA*Center product, follow these steps:

- 1 Access maintenance mode described at the beginning of this chapter.
- 2 Select the **Repair** option and click **Next**. Setup will repair the specified QACenter product.
- 3 After repairing, you may be prompted to restart your computer. If you are prompted to restart your computer, you may choose to restart it now (recommended) or to restart it later.
- 4 Click **Finish** to complete the maintenance.

#### **Uninstalling QADirector**

If you want to remove QADirector, follow these steps:

- 1 Access maintenance mode as described at the beginning of this chapter.
- 2 Select the **Remove** option and click **Next**. The **Confirm File Deletion** dialog box appears.

- 3 Click OK. Setup will remove QADirector from your machine.
- 4 After uninstalling, you may be prompted to restart your computer. If you are prompted to restart your computer, you may choose to restart it now (recommended) or to restart it later.
- 5 Click **Finish** to complete the maintenance.

#### **Uninstalling the QACenter SQL Server Express 2005 Instance**

To remove the *QA*Center SQL Server Express 2005 instance, follow these steps:

**Caution:** All associated data will be lost when you uninstall the SQL Server Express 2005 instance.

- Access maintenance mode as described at the beginning of this chapter and remove the Microsoft SQL Server Desktop Engine (QACENTER).
- 2 Delete any remaining files from the installation directory.

#### Manually Creating and Configuring an Oracle Database

This section provides information about configuring *QADirector* to use an Oracle database.

#### **Oracle Server Requirements**

- An existing database server that runs the supported versions of Oracle. Refer to "System Requirements" on page 12 for details.
- Oracle ODBC drivers for a supported version of Oracle. Refer to "System Requirements" on page 12 for details.
- A database instance set up on the Oracle database server to store *QADirector* data. Use the following specifics to configure the database instance:
  - When the Oracle database instance is defined, you must specify the Storage Character Set as iso 8859-1 West European.
  - The NLS\_LANGUAGE parameter should be set in the parameter file as:

NLS\_LANGUAGE = 'AMERICAN'

If you are using Windows 2000, set the NLS\_LANGUAGE parameter to AMERICAN\_AMERICA.WE8IS08859P1 in the following locations:

HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\ORACLE\NLS\_LANG HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\ORACLE\ALL\_HOMES\IDO\NLS\_LAN G HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\ORACLE\HOME-\NLS\_LANG

• Access to a valid owner name (also known as a *schema*) on the Oracle database server for *QADirector*. This owner name is the user ID that will be associated with each of the product databases.

#### **Creating Database Tables**

Before any client machines can connect to the Oracle database, you must create the database and the database tables for *QADirector*. The SQL\*Plus utility allows you to create the database tables. To create *QADirector* tables, perform the following for each database:

- 1 Do one of the following:
  - On the Oracle server or client machine, open SQL\*Plus Worksheet by clicking Start>Programs>OracleHome>Database
     Administration>SQL\*Plus Worksheet, where OracleHome indicates the home directory where your Oracle database was originally installed.
  - In Windows XP, click the Start menu and choose All Programs>OracleHome>Database Administration>SQL\*Plus Worksheet, where OracleHome indicates the home directory where your Oracle database was originally installed
- 2 Select Connect Directly to a Database.
- **3** Type a user name in the **Username** field. This will be the name of the schema where the *QADirector* tables reside.
- 4 Type a password in the **Password** field.
- 5 Type the name of the service running the database in the **Service** field.
- 6 On the database server from within SQL\*Plus Worksheet, click Menu Worksheet and then click Run Local Script. The Run Local Script File dialog box appears.
- 7 Click the Look In list and navigate to \Cpwr\database\sqlscripts\oracle on the installation media.
- 8 Execute the following scripts in order:
  - ◊ 1\_0rcl.sql
  - ♦ 2\_0rcl.sql
  - ◊ 3\_0rcl.sql
  - ♦ 4\_Common.sq1

♦ 5\_0rcl.sql

## **Manually Creating and Configuring a SQL Server Database**

This section provides information about configuring *QADirector* to use a SQL Server database.

#### **SQL Server Requirements**

- An existing database server that runs a supported version of SQL Server. Refer to "System Requirements" on page 12 for details.
- A database instance on the SQL Server database server to store *QADi*rector data. Use the following specifics to configure the database instance:
  - ◊ If you are using SQL Server 2000, specify the SQL\_Latin1\_General\_CP1\_CI\_AS collation.
- An SQL Server user ID and password to allow the QADirector administrator to set up the database server.

#### **Creating Database Tables using SQL Server 2000**

Once you have created the database, you can create the *QADirector* database tables. *QADirector* includes files that execute scripts and automatically create the tables for you.

- 1 To start the SQL Server Query Analyzer, select **SQL Server Query Analyzer** from the **Tools** menu in the SQL Server Enterprise Manager.
- 2 Select the database from the dropdown list.
- 3 Click File>Open. The Open Query File dialog box appears.
- 4 Click the Look In list and browse to <drive>:\cpwr\database\sqlscripts\mssql on the installation media.
- 5 Select one script at a time, click **Open**, and click the **Run** (green arrow) icon on the toolbar to run each script in the following order:
  - ♦ 1\_MsSql.sql
  - ♦ 2\_MsSql.sql
  - ♦ 3\_MsSql.sql
  - ♦ 4\_Common.sq1
  - ♦ 5\_MsSql.sql

#### **Creating Database Tables using SQL Server 2005 and SQL Server Express**

Once you have created the database, you can create the QADirector database tables. QADirector includes files that execute scripts and automatically create the tables for you.

- 1 Start the SQL Server Management Studio from the **Start** menu.
- 2 Select the database from the dropdown list.
- 3 Click on the New Query icon or click on File>New>Query with current connection.
- 4 Click File>Open>File. The Open File dialog box appears.
- 5 Click the Look In list and browse to <drive>:\cpwr\database\sqlscripts\mssql on the installation media.
- 6 Select one script at a time, click **Open**, and click the **Run** (green arrow) icon on the toolbar to run each script in the following order:
  - ◇ 1\_MsSql.sql
  - ♦ 2\_MsSql.sql
  - ♦ 3\_MsSql.sql
  - ♦ 4\_Common.sq1
  - ♦ 5\_MsSql.sql

If you use the SQL Server Express Utility to create the tables, you must update each script file before executing them. You must add USE <Database Name> to the start of each file. Change <Database Name> to the correct database name.

#### Adding User Rights to the Database (optional)

Once the database and tables have been built, add users and give them access rights using SQL Server Enterprise Manager. Using SQL Server authentication login, create a new login ID and password specifically for SQL Server access. Use this option to create one convenient user name and password to access the *QA*Director database and have each *QA*Director user use the same user name and password to connect to the database. If preferred, create multiple SQL Server user names and passwords.

**Note:** The user name and password used to connect to the SQL Server database is not the same user name and password that is used to connect to *QADirector*.

To create a SQL Server authentication, follow these steps:

- 1 In the left pane of the SQL Server Enterprise Manager, expand the SQL Server Group, and expand the server machine name.
- 2 Expand the **Security** group.
- 3 Select the Add New User icon from the menu. The SQL Server Login Properties dialog box appears.
- 4 Select the **General** tab.
- **5** Type a user name in the Name field (for example, QATeam).
- 6 Select SQL Server Authentication.
- 7 Type the password in the **Password** field.
- 8 From the **Database** drop down menu, select the QADirector database.
- **9** Select the **Database Access** tab and permit the user to access the created database.
- **10** Set up roles and permissions for the Login account:
  - Option A: Ensure the Login account has the db\_owner role.
  - Option B: Ensure all privileges on all QACenter database objects are granted to the newly created Login account. The following is a sample script for granting all privileges on all objects to a user.
- **Note:** Compuware does not assume any responsibility for the use of this script.

### Setting up an ODBC Data Source for Oracle

#### Setting Up a Net Service

- 1 Open the Oracle Net Configuration Assistant and click Next.
- 2 Click Local Net Service Name Configuration and click Next.
- 3 Click Add and click Next.
- 4 Click Oracle 8i or later and click Next.
- 5 Type the Service Name to which you are trying to connect. This may be the database name.
- 6 Click Next.
- 7 Click TCP.
- 8 Type the Host Name. This may be the machine name on which the Oracle server is installed.
- 9 Click Next.
- **10** Click **Perform A Test** and click **Next**.
- 11 Change the user name and password to the user ID you want to use and test the connection.
- 12 Click Next.
- **13** Type the Service Name and click **Finish**.

#### **Creating a System DSN**

1 Do one of the following:

In Windows 2000:

- a Click the Start menu and select Settings>Control Panel>Data Sources (ODBC). The ODBC Data Source Administrator opens.
- **b** Click the **Drivers** tab and select **Oracle ODBC Driver**.

In Windows XP:

- a Select Control Panel>Administrative Tools>Data Sources (ODBC). The ODBC Data Source Administrator opens.
- **b** Click the **Drivers** tab and select **Oracle ODBC Driver**.
- 2 Click the **System DSN** tab.
- 3 Click Add.
- 4 Select **Oracle** from the **Driver** list.
- 5 Click **Finish**. The **Create a New Data Source** dialog box appears.
- **6** Type a Data Source Name (DSN) in the **Data Source Name** field.
- **7** Type a description in the **Description** field.
- 8 Type the database service name in the **Service Name** field. If the database is not local to the computer, type the full name, such as aqw.qaclab.
- **9** Type the user name in the **UserID** field.
- **10** Keep the default settings in the remaining fields and click **OK**.

#### Setting up an ODBC Data Source for SQL Server

At this point you have a database, tables, and users, but no connection to the database. You must set up an ODBC data source on the *QADirector* client machine:

1 Do one of the following:

In Windows 2000:

- a Click the **Start** menu, and select **Settings>Control Panel**.
- **b** Double click the **Data Sources (ODBC)** icon. The **ODBC Data Source Administrator** opens.
- In Windows XP:

- a Click the Start menu and select Control Panel>Administrative Tools>Data Sources (ODBC).
- **b** Skip to step 3.
- 2 Click the **System DSN** tab.
- 3 Click Add.
- 4 Select SQL Server from the Driver list.
- 5 Click Finish. The Create a New Data Source to SQL Server dialog box appears.
- **6** Type an ODBC connection name in the **Name** field.
- 7 Type a description for the ODBC connection in the **Description** field.
- 8 Type the server name in the **Server** field.
- 9 Click Next.
- **10** Select the **With SQL Server Authentication using a login ID and password entered by a user** option.
- **11** Type a user name in the **Login** field.
- **12** Type a password in the **Password** field.
- **13** Click Client Configure.
- **14** Verify that TCP/IP is selected under the network libraries.
- 15 Click OK.
- 16 Click Next.
- **17** Select the **Change the Default Database to** check box.
- **18** Select the *QADirector* database from the database menu.
- **19** Click Next.
- **20** Click **Finish**. The **ODBC Microsoft SQL Server Setup** dialog box appears.
- 21 Click Test Datasource.
- **22** Click **OK** to exit the **ODBC Microsoft SQL Server Setup** dialog box.
- **23** Click **OK** to exit the ODBC Data Source Administrator.

#### **Determining the Port Number**

To find the port number from the Registry:

1 Navigate to HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\Software\Microsoft\Microsoft SQL Server\<InstanceName>\MSSQLServer\SuperSocketNetLib\Tcp.

You should see a folder with the same name as the instance that was created for SQL Server Express 2005. For example: HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\Software\Microsoft\Microsoft SQL Server\QACenter\MSSQLServer\SuperSocketNetLib\Tcp

2 Remember the number for the Topport entry.

To find the port number using SQL Enterprise Manager:

- 1 Open SQL Enterprise Manager.
- 2 Connect to the instance for the SQL Server Express 2005 installation. Example: qacenter.
- 3 Right click on the instance and select **Properties**.
- 4 Click Network Configuration.
- 5 Select TCP/IP from the **Enabled Protocols** list and click **Properties**.

The port number is located in the **Default Port** field.

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
