ChangeMan SSM Multiple Function Menu

0 - Options

Lets the user specify and review both the defaults for the JOB card information and the library where JCL generated by ChangeMan SSM will be saved. (This panel must be updated the first time you access the Synchronization Functions menu.)

1 - Site Administrator

Assign/Revoke Group Admin(s) and Set Up MLS

2 - Group Administrator

Define Groups, Objects, and Authorize Users

C - Change Tracking

History, Problem Determination, and Recovery

S - Detection and Synchronization

Detect Changes and Synchronize Environments

D - Data Extraction

Extract Changed Data in KSDS, Other VSAM, PS or DA Files and Flattened Database

U - Utilities

Utilities and Self-Guided Demo

Change Tracking Component

Group Administrator

Person assigned by the Site Administrator to control data set tracking. Defines tracking groups, specifies data sets to the track groups, and assigns users to the track groups.

Panel Access Path: From the ChangeMan SSM Multiple Function Menu, select Option 2 - Group Administrator.

User

Person assigned by the Group Administrator to one or more track groups.

Panel Access Path: From the ChangeMan SSM Multiple Function Menu, select Option C - Change Tracking.

Group Administrator Menu Options

Panel Access Path: From the ChangeMan SSM Multiple Functions menu, select Option 2 - Group Administrator.

1 - Define Groups

A descriptive name (8 characters) that represents a logical collection of data sets to be defined to the Group for tracking purposes.

2 - Define Objects

Data set(s) defined to a Group (above) to initiate change tracking.

3 - Authorize Users

UserIDs having access to tracking functions for a Group(s).

A - Alternate Group Administrators

UserID(s) assigned by a Group Administrator to act in their absence.

Change Tracking User Menu Options (ISPF Functions)

Panel Access Path: From the ChangeMan SSM Multiple Functions menu, select Option C - Change Tracking.

1 - Capture Object Level (If RTO Not Active in System)

User-initiated data set capture of change Events, for a selected data set, since the last capture.

2 - Capture Group Level (If RTO Not Active in System)

User-initiated group capture of change Events, for all data sets defined to the group, since the last capture.

3 - Query Events

User-initiated Query of the ChangeMan SSM database for change Events in four categories—Member, Data Set, VSAM, and SMF—at an object or group level.

4 - Recall or Restore Members

User specifies PDS member(s) to be recalled or restored from the Delta Master database.

5 - Recover Entire PDS Through Batch

9 - Compare Filtered Members

Invoke comparison utility for only those members with differences.

Detection and Synchronization Component

Detection and Synchronization Menu (ISPF Functions)

Panel Access Path: From the ChangeMan SSM Multiple Functions menu, select Option S - Detection and Synchronization.

1 - Fingerprint

Generate the Fingerprint data set for a group of data sets.

2 - Review Changes

Detect changes introduced to the current environment, since the last Fingerprint generation.

3 - Package Changes

Create a basket of changes to the current environment, since it was fingerprinted.

4 - Package Data Sets

Export a group of data sets into a basket. Used to copy a new environment to a remote machine.

5 - View Basket

Lists the contents of a basket, and the type of action to be performed when the basket is applied.

6 - Apply Basket

Import the changes from a basket to a target environment.

7 - View Fingerprint

List the contents of a Fingerprint Data Set.

8 - Detect Changes

Detect the changes between two fingerprinted environments.

Detection and Synchronization Menu (ISPF Functions) (continued)

9 - Package Changes

Create a basket of changes to an environment, by comparing two Fingerprint data sets.

G - Generate Token

Generate the Fingerprint Token for a single data set or a PDS member

C - Check Synchronization

Verifies the synchronization of two data sets, or group of data sets (cataloged or un-cataloged). Allows byte-level comparison of out-of-sync members.

P - PDS Compare

Create a mem-to-mem report of two partitioned data sets.

S - Synchronize

Synchronizes two local environments in a one-step process.

A - Advanced Functions

Provides access to the advanced functions, which allow more options to be specified.

Detection and Synchronization Advanced Functions Menu (ISPF)

0 - Masking options for Change Detection

Accesses the Masking Options submenu, which allows setting the mask rules for source or text, load modules, and viewing the current masking rules in effect.

1 - Data Set Compare

This function generates the JCL to compare two partitioned data sets. This function provides multiple comparison methods and report options.

2 - Group Compare

This function generates JCL to compare two Groups of data sets, directly or through previously generated Fingerprint data sets. This function provides multiple comparison methods and report options.

3 - Volume Compare

This function generates JCL to directly compare two DASD volumes, or groups of volumes. This function provides multiple comparison methods and report options.

4 - Fingerprinting

Generates JCL to allocate and create the Fingerprint data set for an individual data set, a group of data sets, or an entire DASD volume

5 - Create Basket

Generates JCL that will use two Fingerprint data sets to identify those with different content or whose content has changed (Extract), and then copies the differences (Export), to the Change Basket data set.

6 - Import Basket

Generates JCL to apply the Change Basket to a target environment. A Reverse Basket generation (to undo the changes) is optional.

7 - Undo the Import Operation

Applies the Reverse Change Basket to undo the effects of the previous Import operation.

NOTE During online ISPF operations, all messages are written to a log data set called 'TSO_UserID.DETECT.LOG'. To browse the log, you must first exit your ChangeMan SSM ISPF session to close this file.

Data Extraction Component

Data Extraction Menu

FLAT - Flatten a File and Fingerprint

Flattens a database or library file, and optionally Fingerprints it.

FGP - Fingerprint a VSAM Cluster or Flat File and Save

Fingerprints a VSAM cluster or flat file and saves the record tokens into a Fingerprint Data Set.

COMP - Compare Fingerprints

Compares two data files, directly or represented by their Fingerprint data sets.

DATA - Compares two data files on-screen, for PS/DA and PDS members.

Uses the compare function of ChangeMan SSM to report differences between PDS members, flat files, or a PDS member and flat file.

EXP - Extract and Export

Creates a Change Basket of the changed records by comparing Fingerprint data sets or data files.

IMP - Import & Create Reverse Basket (VSAM ONLY)

Applies the changes from the Change Basket data set. (Reverse Basket generation - optional.)

UNDO - Undo the Import Operation (VSAM ONLY)

Applies the Reverse Change Basket to undo the effects of the previous Import operation.
